AUSTRALIAN COLLECTION

TREE GROVES

Eucalyptus saligna Sydney Blue Gum NSW/Qld 1987 One of the most attractive stands in the arboretum, this beautiful grove of huge pale barked eucalypts is still growing. K 16 \$290 ea tree

Casuarina cunninghamiana River Sheoak NSW,Q, NT, 1987 Everyone likes this shady glade. L 15, \$150 per tree.

Syncarpia glomulifera Turpentine is a glossy rainforest tree is from NSW/Qld, 1990, J 16, #2901 This semi-circle planting is \$450 for group of five strong trees.

OLD GROWTH TREES

Corymbia callophylla Marri, South-West, wildling, this magnificent old growth tree is in the car park. Also one at the breakaway next to Hill View track D 14 \$340 ea

E. patens WA Blackbutt, endemic in Balingup, this massive beauty is in the car park at J 10 \$340

WEST AUSTRALIAN TREES

Golden Valley has a significant collection of West Australian trees including:

Acacia acuminata Jam Wattle A WA classic, 1987, G 16. \$120

Acacia microbotrya Gum Wattle WA wheat belt, 1987 H 14 Right next to beginning of Wattle Walk. \$90

Allocasuarina decussata Karri Oak, Karri Forest 1987 in Picnic site I 10. \$180

Eucalyptus argyphaea Silver Mallet 2009 from our biodiverse Western Woodlands with smooth shiny bark tree K 19 \$180

Eucalyptus astringens sub sp. astringens Brown Mallet from Moora to Hyden this Mallet is the tree of inland SW. At I 19 \$150

E. astringens sub sp. redacta

E. brevistylis Rates Tingle North Walpole district, very rare, 1984 D 18, outstanding specimen tree on hill top near Hill View Track \$430 ***

E. clivicola Green mallet grows from N. of the Stirling Ranges to E. of the Ravensthorpe Range, 2009 I 19 \$150

E. falcata Silver mallet grows from Wickepin to Lake King and Jerramungup. 2009 Next to track at J 20. \$150

E. gardneri subsp. gardneri Blue mallet, WA from Brookton-Kojonup, to Narembeen-Kulin, and near Cadoux, the Blue Mallet is lovely 2009 J 20 \$160

E. gomphocephala Tuart Swan Coastal Plain 1980, growing at top corner, large specimens. The iconic tree of Perth grows well all over the SW land region C 21 \$150

E. guilfoylei Yellow Tingle 1988, North Walpole district. This rare tree is near to the picnic shelter, J 10 \$240

E. longicornis Red Morrel, tree of the central and southern wheat belt and Great Western Woodlands. Growing next to the Hill View Track J 19 \$150

E. macrocarpa Mottlecah, sand plains from Geraldton to Pingelly, restricted in wild, this species has silver foliage and striking summer flowers, 1982 D 20, \$ 180

E. megacornuta Warded Yate Ravensthorpe Range, very rare 1982 (E 19) \$240

E. melanophitra, this Mallet has a very restricted range from Pallinup River - Corackerup Ck to Boxwood Hill, 2009 H 20 \$150

E. newbeyi Beaufort Inlet mallet, Named after a WA landcare legend Ken Newbey, its natural range is restricted to Beaufort Inlet & Fitzgerald River Nat. Park but it is raging in Balingup, 2009 I 19 \$150

E. occidentalis Flat topped Yate 2009 The distinctive gully species of the South coast region. Growing next to the Hill View Track J 19 \$150

E. ornata Ornamental silver mallet, restricted, NE of Kondinin - NE of Hyden, 2009 I 19 \$150

E. praetermissa another unusual mallet with a restricted range S. coast, Beaufort Inlet & Fitzgerald River National Park, 2009 I 19 \$150

E. preissiana Bellfruited Mallee, Stirling Range to Stokes Inlet, rare, 1982 striking large yellow flowers in winter E 19 \$240

E. recta Mt Yule silver mallet Very rare, scattered & very restricted distribution, SE of Moora, Cadoux H 20 \$150

E. salmonophloia Salmon Gum - One of WA's loveliest trees. 2009 \$250

E. sepulcralis Weeping Gum, Fitzgerald River National Park, ghostly silver weeping tree, rare, 1982 \$180

E. spathulata Swamp Mallet, Avon Wheatbelt region, sumptuous copper bark next Hill View track 1984 \$180

E. tenuis an unusual Mallet from E. of Hyden & Lake King - E. of Norseman & S. of Coolgardie, 2009 H 18 \$150

E. tetraptera Four winged Mallee South Coast, stunning flowers, on walk track at F 10.1990 \$90

TALL EUCALYPTS

All these trees are well established, large trees that are growing around the Tall Gum Short Walk. We anticipate they will grow into very tall specimens. \$ 270 ea

E. tereticornis Forest Red Gum x2 Q'd & NSW, 1987
E. sieberi Silvertop Ash NSW/Vic 1987 I 14
E. viminalis Manna Gum Eastern Australia's second tallest tree and the Koala bear's favourite food, at the beginning of the Tall Gum track, 1987 K 12

Acacia doratoxylon Spearwood NSW, ACT, Vic, 1987 F 13 \$90
Acacia elata Cedar Wattle NSW 1987 It's surprising this handsome wattle next to Wattle Walk is still available. Perhaps people think all wattles are short-lived shrubs, but this lovely tree with summer flowers is a tall long-lived beauty. E12 \$160
Acacia melanoxylon Blackwood Tasmania and Victoria, 1987 K 13 \$120
Alphitonia excelsa Soap Tree N.E. Aus, large tree in rainforest glade. 1991, L 15, \$160
Araucaria bidwillii Bunya Pine Queensland, 1989 J 9, These trees are getting pretty big & growing! At the new Picnic site. \$ 250
Araucaria cunninghamii Hoop Pine 1990 Qld/ NSW This advanced tree is in the rainforest glade. K 16 \$220
Backhousia citriodora Lemon Myrtle 1990 from south Queensland this fragrant rainforest species is a delicious culinary favourite. L 16 \$160
Brachychiton discolor Kurrajong 2006 An Ozzie classic F 19 \$160
Brachychiton rupestris Bottle Tree Queensland, 2009 G 18 \$180
Callitris glaucophylla White Cypress Pine 1986 small pockets in all mainland States, fine specimen C 12 \$180
Grevillea robusta Silky Oak 2016 Right on the track L17 \$ 160
Eucalyptus nicholii Narrow leafed Peppermint Gum NSW, 1984 in a pair, these are magnificent specimens D 12 \$200 ea
Hymenospernum flavum Native frangipani 2015 Q'ld & NSW this rainforest species has fragrant flowers L 16 \$160
Melia azerderach Cape Lilac 1996 Yes this is an Australian tree from the Kimberley & across Aus tropics J 11 in car park \$160
Stenocarpus sinuatus Firewheel Tree NSW rainforest, 1990, L 15, #2829 \$ 180
Wollemi nobilis Wollemi Pine Wollemi National Park, NSW. 2014 L 16 \$340

WORLD COLLECTION

HERITAGE PLANTINGS

Heritage Grove Over a hundred years old, this grove of magnificent heritage trees is growing in a peaceful glade near the creek, at the entrance to the arboretum alongside the Bibbulman Track; very peaceful except for the trickle of the winter creek.

Populus serotina “**Aurea**” **Golden Poplar**, selected cultivar, 1937, 203. This beautiful large tree grows next to the bridge at N 13. Disabled access. The loveliest of all the Poplar species. A second huge one is at O 10 near the old well, 748. Both are \$290

Robinia pseudo-acacia **Black Locust**, East USA, original tree #045, S 11, \$190

Schinus molle **Pepper Tree**, Peru, 1935 #227 near old well across creek, this old hollowed tree is a real character at P 11, \$290

OAKS

The Tree Park has the largest oak collection in WA. Most of these trees are rare in Australia. Some listed below date to our first oak plantings in the 1980's and are already large trees.

Quercus acutissima **Sawtooth Oak**, 2007, Korea. This fast growing oak has golden autumn foliage. T9, # 1248. \$250

Q. castaneifolia **Chestnut leafed Oak**, Caucasus & Iran, 1994 is semi-evergreen # 806 \$250

Quercus cerris **Turkey Oak** Asia Minor 2007, #1256 at T 8, \$250

Q. chrysolepis **Canyon Live Oak** SW of USA, 1994, #818 P 9, \$250

Q. ilex **Holm Oak** SW Europe, 1988 #433 next to Oak Grove Track this is the famous fodder oak. Evergreen Q 10 \$250

Q. iberica **Iberica Oak**, Caucasus, 1999, # 814 P 8 \$250

Q. macrocarpa Burr Oak 1988 N. America, #358 Q 11 oak with woven acorn cups. \$250

Q. macrolepis Vallonea Oak 1999 Eastern Mediterranean, evergreen with outstanding character acorn cups worth collecting P 9 #815 \$250

Q. petrea French Oak, France, 2007 #1269, these are the oaks of wine barrel fame and very rare here, as the first plantings in Australia, near walk track. K 7 \$250

Q. phellos Willow Oak, S. East USA, 1988 # 620 & # 621 I 6 one of the most ornamental of the oaks, this magnificent pair are in the Chinampa. \$290 ea

Q. robur 'Fastigiata' Cypress Oak 2005 #1133 A soldier of an oak, this selected cultivar of the English Oak grows in tall upright form hence its name. Q 8 \$250

AUTUMN COLOUR & other INTERESTING SPECIES

Acer monspessulum Montpellier Maple 1985 Mediterranean # 704 Pretty leaf on a dainty tree with strong autumn colour. L 9 \$270

Acer palmatum Japanese Maple, Japan, 1986, one of the best autumn displays in the Park, visible from the road, but on steep slope so hard to access, # 425 at K 7, \$250

Acer rubrum Red Maple 1986 . # 701 In the heart of the Maple grove a large Canadian Maple of this famous species have deep colour L 9 \$350 ea.

Acer rubrum 'October Glory' Red Maple #1280 from eastern Canada & USA. 2005 An outstanding specimen tree for autumn colour. K 8, \$350

Acer saccharinum Silver Maple, East USA, Our only Silver Maple is well grown and lovely but access is on slope. #421, 1986 K 7 \$ 250

Betula nigra Black Birch 1991, N America #653 Pretty tree with nice bark next to creek R 18 \$180

Butia capitata Wine Palm Chile 1992 #1008 & #1009 The delicious autumn berries of this pair can be intoxicating! His and hers? Growing at the bridge. O 14 \$340 for the pair

Calocedrus decurrens Californian Incense Cedar West coast USA, 1997 Two tall globular conifers from California's amazing coniferous heritage, L11 \$270

Carya illinoensis Pecan 1999 #1081 on Bibbulman Track U 19 \$250

Celtis occidentalis Hackberry N. America #716 & 717 right on the Bibbulman Track M10 \$120 ea

Celtis australis Southern Nettle Tree #706 & 1032, 1999 SW Asia; also on the Bib Track M10 \$120ea

Ceratonia siliqua Carob East Mediterranean, 1993 #798 at O 8,. Strong tree but male so no pods. \$180

Crataegus mexicana “*Smithiana*” Red Mexican Hawthorn 1994 # 543 stunning large scarlet haws gets this tree a lot of visitors. Q 12, \$200

Cupressus cashmeriana Kashmir Cypress 2009 #1165 A graceful weeping conifer in the car park. First listing. Rare & unknown in the wild. \$245

Largerstroemia x ‘Natchez’ Crepe Myrtle White flowers and strong autumn colour too. In main car park. #1187 \$135

Liquidambar orientalis x styraciflua Turkish Liquidambar, Asia Minor, 2005 rare and beautiful this Liquidambar colours late and holds the display til winter, disabled access to bed outside Homestead, # 1171 \$290

Livingstonia australis Australian Fan Palm 1992 prominent in the Chinampa. \$180

Magnolia grandiflora Evergreen Magnolia #1206 2006 SE N. America. This young tree is starting to flower. Next to the welcome foot bridge. \$340

Malus floribunda Crab Apple 2004 garden cultivar #1004 in car park \$99

Nyssa sylvatica Tupelo # 1275 & # 1276 2008 Stunning autumn colour. J 8 \$270 ea

Pinus brutia Turkish Pine 2007 #1255 Turkey & Greece - the species that gained iconic species at Gallipoli , growing strongly at S7 \$270

Plantanus occidentalis American Plane #1040 Eastern USA, 2003 V 11, \$270

Plantanus occidentalis American Plane #1029 2003 Eastern USA, in the maple grove at L8 \$250

Plantanus orientalis “Alford Blaze” #943 selected cultivar 2014 this Plane has been selected for good autumn colour. Next to the Oak Grove Track S 10 \$ 225

Populus alba x alba Mahgreb Poplar, North Africa, planted 2005 E 5, the Tree Park’s ‘entry statement’, lovely rare silver leafed poplars, with disabled access. Suit a group or family. \$120 ea

Pyrus salicifolia Weeping Silver Pear Caucasus & Turkey 1999 Small ornamental with silver foliage. On Bibbulman Track. #708,709 &719 L 10 \$130 ea

Salix matsudana ‘*tortuosa*’ Corkscrew Willow 1985 #746 from China & Korea this large character is on the creek. \$160

Salix nigra Black Willow Tall & vibrant willows in pair next to creek in peaceful location next to the creek. Nth America, #743 &745, N 11, \$250 ea or \$340 for pair.

Sequoia sempervirens Redwood, California, 1996 #681 R 17 \$340

Sorbus aucuparia Rowan 1994 #710 a perfect shape & autumn colour L10 \$270

Taxodium distichum Swamp Cypress, S.E. USA , 1998, #636 magnificent tree in autumn, stand out in Chinampa. H 6 \$390

Taxodium macronatum Montezuma Cypress 2015 Very rare in Oz, this is an iconic giant species from Mexico. Rare M 10 \$225

Taxus baccata 'aurea' Golden Yew, N. Africa & Europe, 2006 #1011 if you seek a tree that will live a thousand years, here is your candidate! Slow growing but can live for many centuries, this species is of pagan significance, prominent on Chinampa H 6 \$250
