## *WORLD COLLECTION*

### OAKS

*Golden Valley Tree Park has the largest oak collection in WA. Most of these trees are rare in Australia. Some listed below date to our first oak plantings in the 1980s and are already large trees. Many others have been added since then and are growing strongly.*

***Quercus acutissima, Sawtooth Oak*** 2007 Korea. #1248

A fast growing oak with golden autumn foliage. (T 9) \$700

***Quercus castaneifolia, Chestnut leafed Oak*** 1994 Caucusus & Iran. #806

Is semi-evergreen. (O 8) \$700

***Quercus douglasii, Blue Oak***, 2015 Sierra Nevada. #3549

Drought tolerant deciduous oak. (U 7) \$550

***Quercus engelmannii, Engelmann Oak*** 2015 Southern California. #3550

Beautiful rare oak from California, surveying the main oak grove. (U 7) \$550

**Quercus nigra, Water Oak**, 1988 S.E. North America. #1169  
Growing in a peaceful location near the Chinampa summer pond. Spread your blanket nearby and enjoy the scenery. (I 5) \$700

**Quercus petraea, French Oak**, 2007 British Isles, W. Europe. #1266  
The last one of the French oaks that is not sponsored, strong tree but the access up the slope might be somewhat challenging. (J 6) \$600

**Quercus lobata, Valley Oak**, 1988 California. #351  
Tall deciduous tree known for its longevity in their native California and doing well in our park. It is not far from the footpath in the oak grove. (S 8) \$650

**Quercus robur, English Oak**, Europe. #683.  
One of the last English oaks in the park still waiting for a sponsor. Part of the oak family, as it has sprouted from an acorn of another oak nearby. Already a mature tree, in a prominent location. (Q14) \$700

## **AUTUMN COLOUR & other INTERESTING SPECIES**

**Alnus nepalensis, Nepalese Alder**, 2015, Himalayas #3534  
Young tree native to rocky Himalayas and loving it in our park. Growing on the winter creek line. Can be admired up close or from the footpath. (M 9) \$600

**Betula nigra, Black Birch**, 1991 Nth America. #657  
Last Black birch that is to be sponsored. Located on the way to the Duck Pond and shyly shimmering charm in the company of its own kind. (R 16) \$550

**Butia capitata, Wine Palm**, 1992 Chile. #930 and #3489  
Gracefully swaying their fronds over the Chinampa pond and the green lawn and begging to be noticed for their beauty and the prime location. The fruit is edible and delicious. (H 5) \$350

**Butia capitata, Wine Palm** 1992 Chile. #1008 and #1009  
The delicious autumn berries of this pair can be intoxicating! His and hers?  
To be found growing at the bridge. (O 14) \$650 for the pair or \$350 for one.

**Calocedrus decurrens, Californian Incense Cedar** 1997 West coast USA.  
#1035 and #730 A group of globular conifers from California's amazing coniferous heritage at situated at (L 11) Two of these are available, priced at \$650 each

**Celtis occidentalis, Nettle Tree (Hackberry)** 1999 North America.  
#717 Right on the Bibbulmun Track. (M 10) \$600

**Celtis australis, Southern Nettle Tree** 1999 SW Asia.#706 and #1032 On the Bibbulmun Track. (M 10) \$500 each

**Ceratonia siliqua, Carob** 1993 East Mediterranean. #798 and #1023 Strong trees but male, so no pods. (O 8) \$450 each

**Cornus capitata, Himalayan Evergreen Dogwood**, 1994 Himalaya #680  
Small tree with edible berries, growing amongst its own kind not far from the footpath leading to the Duck Pond. (Q16) \$400

**Fraxinus oxycarpa, Desert Ash**, 1989 S Europe, W. Asia #837,#838,#839  
Large specimen growing uphill from the oak grove, frequented mostly by the peacefully grazing sheep, our master arborists. Once you find it, you will love the tree, the spot and its views. (R 8) \$600

**Gymnocladus dioicus, Kentucky Coffee Tree**, 1992 E. USA #1090  
Tall upright tree with pods that were roasted and used as a coffee substitute, hence the name. Raw pods are toxic so we recommend to just admire this rare tree. (U 9) \$600

**Livingstonia australis, Australian Fan Palm** 1992. #3492  
Prominent in the Chinampa. (H 6) \$500

**Parrotia persica, Ironwood**, 1999 N. Persia #610  
Located near the homestead. You can't miss its stunning autumn colour. (G 4) \$500

**Pinus brutia, Turkish Pine** 2007 Turkey & Greece #1255  
The species that gained iconic status at Gallipoli, growing strongly. (S 7) \$500

**Pinus thunbergii, Japanese Black Pine**, 2011 Japan #1272  
Known to live for hundreds of years, some of the oldest living bonsai are the Black Japanese Pines but here in the park we let it grow as it pleases. In the top location, near the Duck Pond. (T18) \$600

**Platanus occidentalis, American Plane** 2003 Eastern USA. #1040 (V 11) \$600

**Platanus occidentalis, American Plane** 2003. Eastern USA. #1029  
In the maple grove. (L 8) \$600

**Populus alba x alba, Maghreb Poplar** 2005 North Africa.  
The Tree Park's 'entry statement', beside the road near the Homestead.  
Lovely rare silver leafed poplars. Disabled access. Would suit a group or a family. (E 5) \$550 each

**Populus nigra "Italica", Lombardy Poplar** c1935 Northern Italy. #153  
A tall, columnar tree with lots of tales to tell. (Q 10) \$800

**Populus serotina "Aurea", Golden Poplar** 1937 Selected cultivar. #748  
A second huge one, growing near the old well. (O 10) \$800

**Pyrus salicifolia, Weeping Silver Pear** 1999 Caucasus & Turkey.  
#708, and #719 Small ornamental tree with silver foliage.  
On the Bibbulmun Track. (L 10) \$500 each

**Robinia pseudo acacia, Black Locust** c1950s Eastern USA. #045  
One of the original trees. (S 11) \$500

**Salix nigra, Black Willow** 1993 North America. #743 and #745  
Tall and vibrant willows in a pair next to the creek in a peaceful location.  
(N 11) \$500 each or \$800 for the pair.

***Taxodium mucronatum, Montezuma Cypress*** 2015 Mexico & Guatemala. #3558  
An iconic giant species, very rare in Australia. (M 10) \$600

## HERITAGE GROVE

*Over a hundred years old, this special grove of magnificent heritage trees is growing in a peaceful glade near the creek at the entrance to the arboretum, alongside the Bibbulmun Track. Very peaceful except for the trickle of the winter creek. \$1500 each*

## AUSTRALIAN COLLECTION

### OLD GROWTH TREES

***Corymbia calophylla, Marri*** Southwest WA, wildling.  
This magnificent old growth tree is in the car park.  
There is also one at the breakaway next to the Hill View track.     (D 14) \$900 each.

### TREE GROVES

***Eucalyptus saligna, Sydney Blue Gum*** 1987    NSW & Qld.  
One of the most attractive stands in the arboretum, this beautiful grove of huge pale barked eucalypts is still growing. (K 16) \$500 each tree.

***Casuarina cunninghamiana, River Sheoak*** 1987    NSW, Qld & NT.  
Everyone likes this shady glade. (L 15) \$400 each tree.

***Syncarpia glomulifera, Turpentine*** 1990    NSW & Qld. #2901  
A glossy rainforest tree in a semi-circular planting of five strong trees (J 16) \$1000 for the group of five or \$350 each

## WESTERN AUSTRALIAN TREES

Golden Valley has a significant collection of Western Australian trees including:

***Acacia microbotrya* , Gum Wattle** 1987 WA wheatbelt.  
Right next to the beginning of the Wattle Walk. (H 14) \$250

***Eucalyptus argyphaea*, Silver Mallet** 2009.  
Western Woodlands with a smooth shiny bark. A tree from our biodiverse (K 19) \$350

***Eucalyptus astringens sub sp. astringens*, Brown Mallet.** From Moora to Hyden, this mallet is the tree of the inland South West. (I 19) \$350

***Eucalyptus clivicola*, Green Mallet** 2009. Grows from north of the Stirling Range to east of the Ravensthorpe Range. (I 19) \$350

***Eucalyptus gardneri subsp. gardneri*, Blue Mallet** 2009.  
Grows from Brookton-Kojonup to Narembeen-Kulin, and near Cadoux. The blue mallet is lovely. (J 20) \$350

***Eucalyptus longicornis*, Red Morrel.** A tree of the central and southern wheatbelt and Great Western Woodlands. Next to the Hill View Track. (J 19) \$350

***Eucalyptus macrocarpa*, Mottlecah** 1982.  
Found on sand plains from Geraldton to Pingelly, restricted in the wild. This species has silver foliage and striking summer flowers. (D 20) \$350

***Eucalyptus megacornuta*, Warded Yate** 1982.  
Very rare tree from the Ravensthorpe Range. (E 19) \$400

***Eucalyptus melanophitra*** 2009. This mallet has a very restricted range from Pallinup River - Corackerup Creek to Boxwood Hill. (H 20) \$350

***Eucalyptus newbeyi*, Beaufort Inlet Mallet** 2009. Named after a WA landcare legend Ken Newbey, its natural range is restricted to the Beaufort Inlet and Fitzgerald River National Park, but it is ranging in Balingup. (I 19) \$350

***Eucalyptus occidentalis*, Flat topped Yate** 2009. Distinctive gully species of the South coast region. Growing next to the Hill View Track. (J 19) \$350

***Eucalyptus ornata*, Ornamental Silver Mallet** 2009.  
Restricted area from north east of Kondinin to north east of Hyden. (I 19) \$350

***Eucalyptus praetermissa***, 2009. Another unusual mallet with a restricted range around the Beaufort Inlet and Fitzgerald River National Park. (I 19) \$350

***Eucalyptus recta*, Mt Yule Silver Mallet.** Very rare, with a scattered & very restricted distribution the south east of Moora and Cadoux. (H 20) \$350

***Eucalyptus sepulcralis, Weeping Gum*** 1982. Fitzgerald River National Park. A ghostly silver weeping tree. Rare. \$350

***Eucalyptus spathulata, Swamp Mallet*** 1984. Avon and wheatbelt region. Has a sumptuous copper bark. Growing next to the Hill View track. \$350

***Eucalyptus tenuis*** 2009. An unusual Mallet from east of Hyden and Lake King to east of Norseman and south of Coolgardie. (H 18) \$350

## TALL EUCALYPTS

*All these trees are well established, large trees growing around the Tall Gum Short Walk. We anticipate they will grow into very tall specimens. \$600 each.*

***Eucalyptus dives, Broad-leafed Peppermint*** 1987 Vic & NSW. (I 15)

***Eucalyptus maidenii, Maiden's Gum*** Southern NSW. (I 13)

***Eucalyptus tereticornis, Forest Red Gum*** (x2) 1987 Qld & NSW.

***Eucalyptus sieberi, Silvertop Ash*** 1987 NSW & Vic. (I 14)

## OTHER AUSTRALIAN TREES

***Acacia doratoxylon, Spearwood*** 1987 NSW, ACT & Vic. (F 13) \$200

***Acacia melanoxylon, Blackwood*** 1987 Tas & Vic. (K 13) \$200

***Alphitonia excels, Soap Tree*** 1991 North east Australia.  
Large tree in the rainforest glade. (L 15) \$350

***Araucaria bidwillii, Bunya Pine*** 1989 Queensland.  
These trees are getting pretty big & growing! At the new picnic site. (J 9) \$1200

***Araucaria cunninghamii, Hoop Pine*** 1990 Qld & NSW.  
This advanced tree is in the rainforest glade. (K 16) \$400

***Brachychiton rupestris, Bottle Tree*** 2009 Queensland. (G 18) \$300

***Callitris glaucophylla, White Cypress Pine*** 1986.  
Small pockets found in all mainland States. A fine specimen. (C 12) \$300

***Eucalyptus nicholii, Narrow leafed Peppermint Gum*** 1984 NSW.  
In a pair, these are magnificent specimens. (D 12) \$350 each

***Hymenospernum flavum, Native frangipani*** 2015 Qld & NSW.  
This rainforest species has fragrant flowers. (L 16) \$300

***Melia azederach, Cape Lilac*** 1996. Yes, this is an Australian tree from the Kimberley & across the Australian tropics. In the car park at (J 11) \$300

***Stenocarpus sinuatus, Firewheel Tree*** 1990 NSW rainforest. #2829  
(L 15) \$450
